- 2. Third countries associated to the Programme: North Macedonia, Serbia, Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway, Turkey
- 3. Third countries not associated to the Programme: rest of the world



2. Teaching and Research

New introductory or advanced teaching programmes or courses designed to be embedded in the official curriculum of a higher education institution.





Module

- short teaching programmes or courses in the field of European Union studies
- minimum duration of 40 teaching hours per academic year
- one particular discipline in European studies or be multidisciplinary in approach
- direct contact hours (no individual tutorials)
- short specialised or summer programmes (distance learning)





Chair

- teaching posts with a specialisation in European Union studies
- held by only one professor (permanent staff members)
- minimum 90 teaching hours per academic year
- additional hours and support of other staff possible
- good practice example during workshop: Fostering EU resilience through European identity building





Centre of Excellence

- focal points of competence and knowledge on EU subjects
- synergies between the various disciplines and resources in European studies
- reaching out to students from faculties not normally dealing with EU issues
- only one at a time per HEI
- should seek to become structured centres providing EU specific high level knowledge





Specifications

- 1. single HEI application
- 2. HEIs from all countries except Belarus and Russian Federation
- 3. duration: 3 years
- 4. maximum grant:
 - module: 30 000 €
 - chair: 50 000 €
 - centre of excellence: 100 000 €
- 5. co-financing: 75 % (module, chair); 80 % (centre of excellence)
- 6. funding model: fixed lump sum (module, chair); customized lump sum (centre of excellence)





3. Teacher Training

support schools and VET providers in planning, organising and delivering EU content in their curricular and extracurricular activities





Teacher Training

- develop new skills, to teach and engage on EU matters
- better understanding of the EU and its functioning
- deliver specific individual or group training courses (modular, residential, blended or online) for teachers interested in the EU and willing to integrate EU subjects in their daily work
- for teachers in schools and Vocational Education and Training (VET) providers

Applicant:

- HEI providing initial and/or in service training to teachers of schools and/or VET institutions (ISCED 1 4); or
- Teacher Training / Education Institution / Agency providing initial and/or in- service training to teachers of schools and/or VET institutions (ISCED 1 - 4)





Specifications

- 1. single HEI application
- 2. HEIs from: EU member states or third countries associated to the programme
- 3. duration: 3 years
- 4. maximum grant: 300 000 €
- 5. co-financing: 80 %
- 6. funding model: customized lump sum





4. Networks

The final aim of the thematic networks is to provide regular feedback on the most advanced and innovative practices in the field, supporting and adding value to the debate.





Networks

- 1. in HE sector
- 2. in other fields of education and training
- collect, share and discuss among the partners research findings, content of courses and experiences, products
- establish a tool allowing the partners to share their academic works and run peer review exercises
- 1. Digital Transformation in Europe (internal EU issue)
- 2. Values and Democracy (foreign policy issue)
- 3. EU Africa (foreign policy issue)





Specifications

- 1. application: 10 -12 partners (depending on type of network)
- 2. HEIs from: EU member states or third countries associated to the programme + third countries not associated to the programme (depending on type of network)
- 3. duration: 3 years
- 4. maximum grant: 1 000 000 € 1 200 000 € (depending on type of network)
- 5. co-financing: 80 %
- 6. funding model: customized lump sum
