




#### HIGHER EDUCATION INSTITUTIONS (HEI) OF THE REPUBLIC OF UZBEKISTAN



#### OVERALL NUMBER OF HIGHER EDUCATION INSTITUTIONS (HEIs) - 186








#### NON-PUBLIC AND FOREIGN HEIS - 73




### **Capacity Building for Higher Education**

- Uzbekistan: 43 CBHE projects for 6 calls (2015-2020)
- Total budget for 43 CBHE projects: 36.6 mln. Euro, for Uzbekistan HEIs 11.5 mln. euro (31,4%)
- 48 local HEIs
- 104 HEIs from 27 EU MS
- 99 HEIs from 15 PC (MN, VN, NP, CN, IL and KS)






#### **Grantholders in CBHE projects in Uzbekistan**

(2015–2020)






## **European HEIs** (27 EU Member States, North Macedonia, TK, UK) involved in CBHE projects in Uzbekistan (2015–2020)








### All country regions in Erasmus+




#### Top 10 HEIs of Uzbekistan in Tempus IV and Erasmus+ CBHE (I-VI) projects

#### **Findings and Conclusions**

#### Impact of Erasmus + projects at the national level:

- Capacity building of academic and administrative staff
- Introduction of new methods of quality management in education and modern teaching methodology
- New joint curricula on a bilateral basis with European partners
- Sustainable partnership with European partners



#### **Recommendations at the national level:**

- Support the efforts of project teams on ensuring systemic impact of project outcomes
- Providing more opportunities for autonomy of HEIs in Uzbekistan internationalisation
- To harmonize national quality indicators with ESG (European Guidelines and Standards for Quality Assurance)
- To conduct regular dissemination activities and information events **promoting the project results** with the involvement of the mass media;
- Create a network (association) of Erasmus+ project coordinators and managers
- Actively promote project outcomes in professional communities




## 7 new CBHE projects






